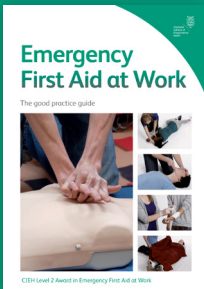




CIEH Level 2 Award in Emergency First Aid at Work

Who needs this qualification?

Anyone identified by their employer as being suitable to take on the role of an emergency first aider in their workplace.

Why is this training important?

The Health and Safety (First-Aid) Regulations 1981 place a general duty on employers to provide first-aid treatment to employees within the workplace environment. The employer has overall responsibility for the risk assessment (assessment of first-aid need) that will establish the level of first-aid cover required. If, having assessed first-aid needs, an employer decides to appoint first aiders, the first aiders must have a valid certificate of competence.

Learning outcomes

Successful candidates will be able to:

- understand the roles and responsibilities of a first aider
- assess an incident
- manage an unresponsive casualty who is breathing normally
- manage an unresponsive casualty who is not breathing normally
- recognise and assist a casualty who is choking
- manage a casualty with external bleeding
- manage a casualty who is in shock
- manage a casualty with a minor injury
